Your days will be packed with service and your nights full of fellowship and maybe a little fishing.

PROJECT COST & APPLICATION DEADLINE

Early-Bird \$700 + Airfare to Anchorage

All paperwork and money received by Alaska Missions by cutoff dates as follows:

Paperwork and monies are due to Alaska Missions 60 days prior to the start of the mission week.

Example: Your Week begins June 1st - therefore your paperwork and payments are due by April 1st or you fall under Regular Registration pricing.

Regular Registration \$750 + Airfare to Anchorage

(Paperwork and/or money received after the 60-day cut off listed above.)

Cost includes:

- Meals: Meals are included as detailed in the *Snapshot of the Week* section.
- Lodging: 1 night in Anchorage and 6 nights lodging in Soldotna. You will be provided a cot, sleeping bag, pillow, and pillowcase.
- Local Transportation: Alaska Missions will provide local transportation. **NOTE: Teams with less than 10 members may be sharing a vehicle with another team.**
- Background check.
- *Individual is responsible for airfare.*

PARTICIPANTS

Suggested for:

- Ages – College, Adult, and Seniors

- Individuals and Groups (max size 50)
 - Skilled in construction trades a plus
- Education/Experience/Language:

- Language – English

WHAT TO BRING

- Personal toiletries, lip balm, lotion, etc.
- Towel and washcloth
- Water bottle
- Warm Clothes – Alaska can have drastic temperature swings
- Warm hat, scarf, and gloves/mittens
- GOOD RAIN GEAR – Rain won't stop our work!
- House shoes/Crocs for indoor wear – Alaskans do not wear shoes inside the house
- Ear plugs if you are a light sleeper.
- Cell phone/charger – Your phone should have service in most places around the state.
- Bible and journal
- Speak with our *project coordinator* for specialty construction equipment needs
